409 Matters arising

- 1) Ref₀ 386 & 398. A vote of thanks to the Chairman for the special Silver Jubilee leaflet was carried unanimously.
- 2) Ref. 397. The Clerk reported that Mrs.Cameron had agreed to act as his assistant and take the minutes of meetings from July. This arrangement was approved.
