## 1983 DISTRICT & COUNTY COUNCIL MATTERS

Councillor Robin Munday reported that the partnership with East Devon had gone through both Councils. Mark Williams is to become the Chief Executive of both authorities. A committee has been formed to progress the partnership. The initial agreement is for 4 years.

There has been a 2% rise in Council Tax which will fund the 'sort it plus' scheme due to start midway through the next financial year. Inflation is now on the rise which may lead to increased costs.

The site by the band hut has been inspected and it is fertile land. The District Council will approach people on the allotment waiting list and if they are interested they can clear the land but the District Council will not undertake this work. The Parish Council could take over the running of allotments from the District Council. Councillor Stella Abbey commented that the Parish Council had already discussed this matter and had decided against running the allotments due to the increase in work load coupled with the very small amount of financial gain.

- b) Councillor Roger Beer reported on the meeting with Adrian Moore and the architect. The sub committee felt that they could not progress further with their plans or grant applications without employing an architect. A quote of £425 for the basic plans and costs has been received from Swann Paul. Is another quote needed? Councillor Robin Munday suggested that as it is a specialised field and this was a local company who had done work for the District Council it was probably not necessary. The Parish Council agreed to the quote.

Councillor Roger Beer also reported that they had spoken with the Adrian Moore from the District Council about the risk assessments. It had been agreed that the platforms for the mulitplay did not need replacing immediately; the Parish Council could repair these themselves with trailer board. The bolts under the fixed bench need to be cut off. Councillor Roger Beer had agreed to do this. The other bench would remain unfixed and the risks had been considered. The play surface should be repaired when the weather allows.
